SCHOOL NEWSLETTER April 12th, 2021


Despite the weather feeling like January or February, it IS actually April, and we are in the final stretch for the 2020/21 school year. This has certainly been a year unlike any, and it will continue to cement itself as a most unique and unusual year: our grade 10-12 students will be returning full time on Monday, April 19th, which means that we will be readjusting our timetable to make this happen. Grade 10-12 students will be working from home on Thursday, April 15th and Friday, April 16th to give the teachers and guidance counsellors time to get ready for this. Please note our grade 8 and 9 students WILL continue to come to school on these days. I have included the new bell schedule and day structure for the grades 10-12 students in this newsletter.

With the increase in volume of students in the building, it will be more important than ever to follow the guidelines for the common spaces in the school: we must wear masks in the hallways, use the proper grade-designated doors, and stay out of the hallways as much as possible. We are keeping our fingers crossed that the weather will become more springlike, which will give students an opportunity to enjoy the outdoors as opposed to being in the building.

In addition to preparing for the full-time return of the grade 10-12 students, we are also well into planning for next year. We are very excited to be able to expand our programming, and will be introducing a STEM program for grade 11 students in English and French, as well as an Indigenous Academy program. Full-Time Return of Grades 10-12 Students

As we plan for our grades 10-12 students to return full-time on Monday, April 19th, we can now share with you the schedule that we will follow for the final 8 weeks of the semester. Effective April 19th, here is the structure of the grades 10-12 schedule:

Block A 8:40-9:50 Trans-9:50-9:55 Block B-9:55-11:05 Lunch-11:05-11:40 Block C-11:40-12:50 Trans-12:50-12:55 Block D-12:55-2:00 Trans-2:00-2:05 2:05-2:45 Tutorial-

Grade 8 and 9 schedules remain unchanged.

There are some students whose schedules will need to be adjusted due to some anomalies that the change in the year has caused. Our counsellors are looking at each of these situations on an individual basis to create a solution that works best for the student. Work from Home for Grades 10-12 Students

On Thursday, April 15th, and Friday, April 16th, students in grades 10-12 will be working from home while teachers and counsellors prepare for the full-time return to school. Students in grades 8 and 9 WILL continue to come to school on these days.

Covid Guidelines in Public Spaces

With the increase in the number of students in our main building, it will be imperative that we all follow the Covid guidelines that are in place for public spaces. This includes: using the grade-designated door to enter and exit he building, wearing masks in common spaces such as hallways and the atrium, and leaving the building for lunches when possible.

Students will continue to not be permitted to eat lunch in the common spaces in the main building. We currently have designated lunch rooms for grade 9 students, and we will be designating lunch rooms for our senior students when they return. As mentioned, we strongly encourage students to enjoy the outdoors during the lunch break.

belonging at school


About the OurSCHOOL Student Survey:

- Based on their feedback, students have the opportunity to be involved in action plans fostering increased student engagement
- Participation in the survey is voluntary, however, all students are encouraged to participate.
- The time required to complete the survey may vary, but it is designed to be completed in approximately 35-40 minutes.


